

Directions:

Chateau Elan Resort is located 30 minutes north of Atlanta, off I-85 at Exit 126. From the South, turn left off of the exit onto Hwy. 211 and cross over the interstate. From the North, turn right onto Hwy. 211.

The Equestrian Center, Winery, Inn and Spa are the first gate on the left. After entering the property, take the first left just a short way past the entrance gate; the horse show grounds will be on your right after the large curve.

SHAVINGS - Initial bedding will be delivered based on requests noted on entry blanks; additional shavings may be ordered at the show office as follows: between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm Friday (day prior to show) - between 8:30 am and 2:00 pm Saturday; no deliveries on Sunday.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

In all classes wherein the rules of the sanctioning association(s) do(es) not apply, Management shall settle any dispute or question that may arise and its decision shall be final. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition or entries, and cancel or combine classes, or to reschedule classes, to change rings or rotate judges; and to change specifications in jumper classes. Management may designate a jumping order, use THE ONE MINUTE RULE, and/or use a "dotted line".

ENTRIES

- 1) No horse may participate in the event or be on the grounds without having a completed entry blank, including signatures acknowledging the agreement printed thereon. **No additional charge for class adds or scratches.**
- 2) Owners and exhibitors are responsible for all horses and fees incurred by them or their agents, even though payment may not be submitted along with the entry. Fees owed from previous shows may be added to this or future show accounts.
- 3) CLOSING DATE is stated on officials' page and entry blank. ENTRIES received after closing date incur an additional fee of \$15 per horse. Refunds for entries are given with cancellation prior to show less a \$15 processing fee.
- 4) RETURNED CHECKS will be assessed \$20.00 for each re-deposit and \$50 if check cannot be presented through a bank as a cash item. Checks remaining unnegotiable after one re-deposit will be referred to the sanctioning organizations for disciplinary action if not replaced by cashier's check or money order within five (5) business days of notice.
- 5) NUMBERS are issued only with completed entry blank and an open check in the office.
- 6) ADDITIONAL FEES may be incurred including: Grounds fee \$30 (for entries not requiring a stall).
- 7) MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Management, Staff, and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No minor's entry will be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian.
- 8) Horses and ponies may enter no more than 7 classes over fences, including equitation and all special classes such as Classics.
- 9) Hard hats must be worn by all mounted riders at all times. All riders must wear ASTM-SEI Approved Helmets with a properly-adjusted (snug) harness.

PRIZE MONEY: credited to fees owed. If exhibitor has a credit not applied at show, credit will be carried forward.

TROPHIES & RIBBONS: Every class offered herein will be awarded six ribbons.

CHAMPION AND RESERVE: awarded based on 10,6,4,2,1,1/2 in divisions with at least three classes. Champion and Reserve will each receive a trophy and ribbon.

MEASUREMENT: Entries must present a valid card or be measured before showing.

DISCOURTESY: to any person by any owner, rider, trainer, or groom will disqualify any horses with which they are associated and fees for horses forfeited.

HUNTER CLASSES: judged on performance, soundness, manners. Suitability of animal and rider will be emphasized with extreme speed penalized. **FENCES:** shall simulate obstacles found in the hunt field such as natural rails, gates, and walls. **UNDER SADDLE:** classes to walk, trot, and canter.

FEED AND BEDDING: FEED NOT AVAILABLE AT THIS SHOW; shavings may be ordered upon arrival or by faxing an order to 904-396-4106 no later than WEDNESDAY preceding the show.

RV/CAMPER SPACES: Water & electric hookups available. \$50 fee assessed ; includes trailers with living quarters which are connected to any electric or water service on show grounds.

STALLS: 10x10 permanent w/ doors available the day before show. ONE STALL PER ANIMAL. NO SHARING OF STALLS; early arrival requires prior communication with show management. Temporary stabling may be erected.

SCHOOLING: in designated areas only. **HELMETS MUST BE WORN WHENEVER MOUNTED.** A Medic is on duty only when scheduled classes are performing and during controlled schooling on Friday between 1:00-6:00pm. **No schooling over fences allowed in Show Rings prior to showing each day.** Starters have authority to scratch riders who do not follow directions.

DOGS: Must be leashed and under control or \$50 will be assessed the Owner and dog may be impounded.

COGGINS TESTS: Negative certificates dated within 1 year are required for admittance to the grounds.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Operated by licensed drivers and in accordance with state and local laws.

FOOTING: Rings and warm-up areas are M-10 aggregate

RING SIZE (all are approximate): Outside ring I: 240' x 145'; Covered Arena: 245' x 125'; outside ring II: 240' x 130'; Schooling areas 240' x 120'.

BRAIDING STRICTLY OPTIONAL.

We realize that tradition is to braid. However, in order to combat the rising costs of everything associated with showing your horse, we have decided to have a **BRAIDING OPTIONAL** policy this year. Should you wish to braid for photographic or other personal reasons, we will ask the judges not to penalize you as well as not to give you extra credit for braiding. Judges should not take into consideration braiding when pinning the class.

These horse shows are Local Member Shows of the *Georgia Hunter Jumper Association, Inc.* and are operated in accordance with the current rules of GHJA. Every person who participates in the show is responsible for a knowledge of and is subject to GHJA rules. The following classes/divisions are recognized by GHJA and points won in classes with three or more entries will count toward year-end high-score awards for those entries who have a current membership and horse recording.

BE SURE WE HAVE YOUR GHJA OWNER, RIDER AND HORSE NUMBERS IF YOU WANT YOUR POINTS TO COUNT

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER - open to riders ages 12 years and under, on horses or ponies, in their first or second year of showing over fences higher than 18" in any hunter show. A rider may cross enter only in either Schooling Pony or Jr/Sr Hunter (2'6" only) at the same show, and may also enter age group equitation (not to include GHJA Equitation or any "medal" type classes) and non-recognized classes where fence heights do not exceed 2'6". Rider may show in Short Stirrup classes for two consecutive show years. Fence height 2'.

PONY HUNTER DISTANCES - Distances will be measured in accordance with USEF guidelines.

SMALL PONY HUNTER - open to ponies not to exceed 12.2 hands. Fences 2'.

MEDIUM PONY HUNTER - open to ponies over 12.2 but not exceeding 13.2 hands. Fences 2'3".

LARGE PONY HUNTER - open to ponies over 13.2 but not exceeding 14.2 hands. Fences 2'9".

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER - open to riders 13 and over on horses or ponies. Rider cannot have shown over fences higher than 2'6" in the past five (5) years. Riders may compete in this division for no more than 2 years and may cross enter only into classes where fences do not exceed 2'6". Fences 2'3". Ribbons awarded for classes combined with Short Stirrup if insufficient entries. Year will begin December 1st and end November 30th. Riders are eligible to ride in this division for two consecutive years.

JUNIOR/SENIOR HUNTER - Fence height 2'6". Open to junior and adult amateur riders on horses or ponies; horse/rider combination may have never shown over fences 3'3" or higher.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER - open to all horses ridden by an amateur. Fences 3'.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER - open to all horses ridden by a junior. Fences 3'.

OPEN HUNTER - open to all horses or ponies. Fences 2'6" or 3'; rider's option.

JUNIOR/AMATEUR HUNTER - open to junior or adult amateur riders on horses. Fences 3'3".

GREEN WORKING HUNTER - open to horses in their first or second year of showing. 1st Year - Fences 3'; 2nd Year - Fences 3'3".

REGULAR WORKING HUNTER - open to any horse or rider. Fences 3'6"

AGE GROUP EQUITATION - 11 & Under, fences 2'; **12-14**, fences 2'6"; **15-17**, fences 3'.

ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION - fences 3'.

GHJA EQUITATION CLASSES (riders must be members of GHJA to compete; minimum 3 riders must complete)

J.D. Pounds Equitation for Juniors on Horses - fences 3' over a modified jumper-type course with at least one oxer and one change of direction. Minimum of six riders, if available, will show at walk, trot and canter to count 25%. No martingales in flat phase.

GHJA Equitation for Juniors on Ponies - fences 2' (s), 2'3" (m) and 2'9" (l); over a modified jumper-type course with at least one oxer and one change of direction. Minimum of six riders, if available, will show at walk, trot and canter to count 25%. No martingales in flat phase.

GHJA Equitation for Adult Amateurs - fences 3'; over a modified jumper-type course with at least one oxer and one change of direction. Minimum of six riders, if available, will show at walk, trot and canter to count 25%. No martingales in flat phase.

GHJA Junior's Equitation Challenge - Open to all Junior and Amateur GHJA members on horses or ponies. To be judged at a walk, trot and canter. Riders will be asked to ride without stirrups and to canter on the counter lead. Riders receiving outside assistance or coaching while in competition will be eliminated. This class is also Phase I of the RMI Equitation Challenge.

LOW SCHOOLING JUMPER - open to any horse and rider. Fences not to exceed 3'.

Jumper ties for other than first place will be broken by time in the first round.

THE FOLLOWING DIVISIONS ARE UNRATED BY GHJA:

PLEASURE HORSE/PONY - open to any horse or pony ridden by junior or adult. Pleasure Horse/Pony will be split in two sections if there are at least four (4) entries in each section. Pleasure Horse/Pony Basic will be asked to walk, trot, canter and halt; Pleasure Horse/Pony Advanced will be asked to walk, trot, canter, hand gallop, halt, and back; Pleasure Horse/Pony Hack will be asked to walk, trot, canter, halt and individually jump two fences designated by the judge set at 18".

WALK-TROT - open to inexperienced riders on horses or ponies; may only cross enter into Walk-Trot-Canter Equitation or Pleasure Horse/Pony. Walk-Trot Under/Saddle judged on animal's way of going and manners; Walk-Trot Pleasure judged on animal's manners and appearance of a pleasurable ride; Walk-Trot Equitation judged on rider's position and control- may be asked to sit trot and post trot and/or halt.

WALK-TROT-CANTER EQUITATION - open to inexperienced riders on horses or ponies; may only cross-enter into Walk-Trot, Cross-Rails or other flat classes. W-T-C Equitation Basic will be asked to walk, posting trot, canter; judged on rider's position and control. W-T-C Equitation Advanced will be asked to walk, sitting trot, posting trot, canter, halt and back; judged on rider's position and control. W-T-C Equitation Hack will be asked to walk, sitting trot, posting trot, canter, and individually jump two fences designated by the judge set as cross rails. May trot jumps without penalty.

JUMPER DIVISIONS: Show Championships will be awarded for Jumper divisions offering three or more classes with points accumulated over both days. Classes will be held with Tables as noted on schedule: Table 2(b)-time first jump-off; Table 2(c)-power and speed; Table 2.1-time first round.

CROSS RAILS - Open to inexperienced junior or amateur riders on horses or ponies. Will NOT be penalized for trotting between fences or to get lead changes. Riders may not cross enter into any class having a fence height greater than 2'.

MINI HUNTER - Open to inexperienced junior or amateur riders on horses or ponies. Riders may not cross enter into any class having a fence height greater than 2'3". Verticals 18".

PRE-GREEN HUNTER - Open to inexperienced horses or ponies. Horse may not cross enter into any class having a fence height greater than 3'.



JR/SR EQUITATION - open to any rider; rider may NOT cross-enter in classes having a fence height greater than 2'6".

Blue/Red Warm-up: TIME PERMITTING - open to any horse or pony at any height; multiple trips allowed. Score of 75-79; red ribbon/Score of 80+; blue ribbon.

RMI CHALLENGE EQUITATION - offered in three phases over two days; Numerical score for each phase - Overall Winner recognized based on combined three scores. Section A to jump 2'6"; for riders who have jumped over 2'6" at this horse show. Section B to jump 2'; for riders who have not jumped over 2'6" at this show. Flat phase in conjunction with GHJA Junior Equitation Challenge Flat class. Written Phase - exhibitor must complete a written multiple choice exam to be submitted to the show office by 5:00pm Saturday(25% of overall score). Flat Phase - Riders to receive a score based on a flat class format (25% of overall score). Jump Phase - Riders to receive a score based on a course which MAY include a gymnastic elements (50% of overall score). A set each of ribbons for flat and jumping phase will be awarded. If less than three (3) entries in either section, class will be judged together with fences at two heights.
